- **Short version**

 - A quality system for an institution, product or service must include the entire process
 - Resources are limited and must be used effectively at all times
- **Longer version**

- Action points (1.4 and 4.1) in the Science and technology policy council strategic plan 2014 - 2016

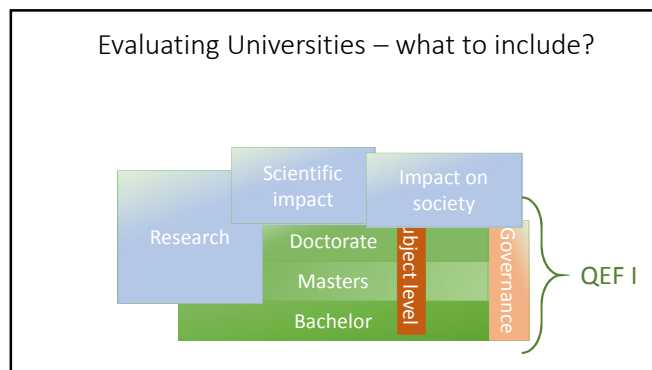


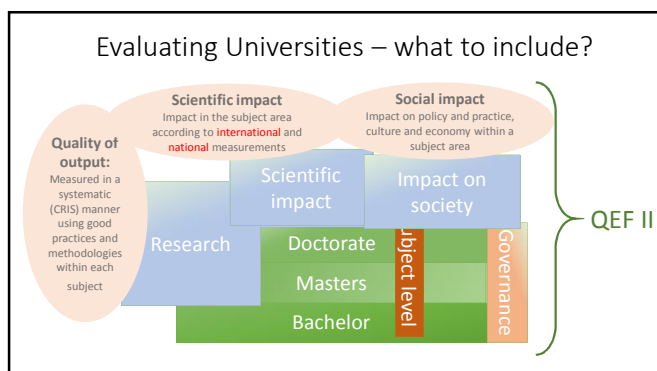
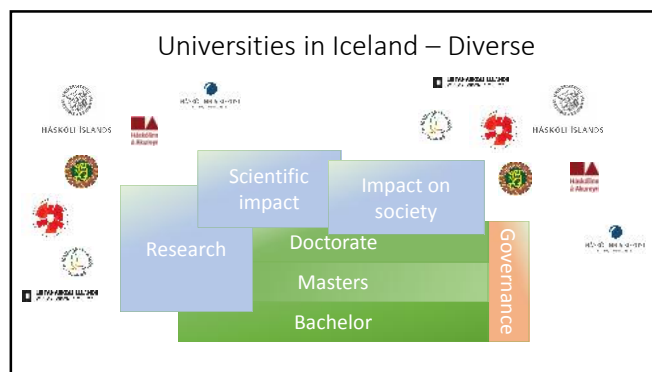
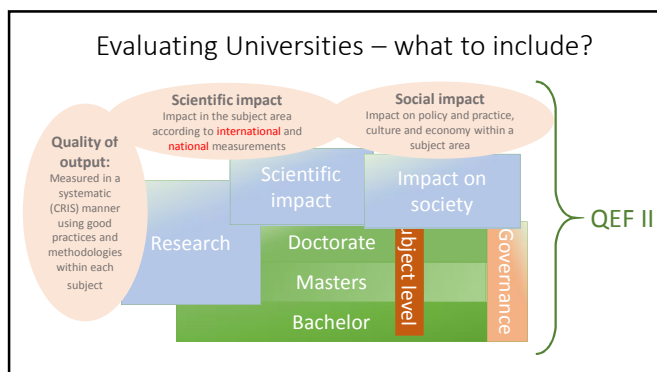
ENQA – Standards and guidelines (2015)

- ### What is quality research?
- Frascati Manual is 255 pages! on how to report and monitor R&D activities (and is currently undergoing its 7th revision)
 - Big differences between subject areas and field of study
 - Natural Science vs. Social Sciences
 - Basic research vs. Empirical research
 - Quality Enhancement system is NOT a ranking system
 - It is a framework to improve quality within a subject/division/institution
 - It is all about how HEI can improve within itself and can be trusted to do so continuously
 - It is therefore essential that the mission and vision of each HEI from a research and teaching perspective is clear and transparent and that the mission is achieved by dialogue with the funding agency (in Iceland = Government)
 - Such framework for the system gives clear objectives and goals to measure quality and performance

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
